Part C: create	 writing a review and posting on IF website working in a team to produce a film or animation for a competition / programme attending a programming day to curate a programme for a festival* programming and screening an inschool/youth club film festival designing and making posters/tickets/invites/programme for a film festival 	Note: Part C activities should be evidenced separately from Part A – Part A focuses on taking part in activities, while Part C is about creating a piece of work. The process as well as the final piece should be recorded in arts logs.	a record of their art work & how they created it
Part D: present	Children and young people should present what they achieved and enjoyed through their experience of Arts Award Explore. This might include their film reviews, the art work they created and what they found out about film industry professionals and organisations. This could take the form of: • reading reviews to group/film club sharing review online • showing film/animation at a celebratory screening/film club • films programmed and screened at Into Film Festival/ school/club • presenting skills learned from	Build in opportunities for children and young people to discuss what they achieved and enjoyed throughout the process of doing Arts Award Explore, as well as presenting their work.
